Our sensory atelier provides structured activities designed to stimulate and engage a child's senses (sight, hearing, touch, smell, taste). This class offers hands-on experiences that help toddlers explore different textures, sounds, colors, and smells through play. Sensory classes are beneficial for cognitive development, as they help your kid learn to process and interpret sensory information, which is fundamental for more advanced cognitive skills.

Some examples of activities that we will be doing :

Messy play: activities like playing with sand, water, rice, or other textured materials.

Sound exploration: using musical instruments, rattles or listening to different sounds

Visual stimulation: exposure to bright colors, and moving objects

Texture exploration: feeling different fabrics, smooth surfaces, or bumpy materials

Smell and taste exploration: using scented objects or edible materials.

PAPER MACHE ANIMALS

In this class students will learn how to create a three dimensional representation of an animal of their choice. First students will think about what elements are necessary to depict their animal. We will look at various sculpture compositions and how much of the animal will be depicted in order for the animal's essence to be represented. Students will use artistic license to create a variety of compositions. As a class we will discuss what compositions are the most compelling. Wire will be used to create the rough skeletal structure of the animal allowing students to determine their sculpture's size and take their 2-D idea and transform it into a 3-D sculpture. Teamwork with another class mate will be used while building their 3-d structure with wire. The skeletal structure will then be filled with balloons, cardboard, plastic bottles in order for the skeletal structure to have "muscle" for the paper mache to rest on. The Paper Mache will add the skin to the 3D structure. Once the skeletal structure is complete students will use paint and other materials - feathers, yarn, (or any other materials brought in from home) to create their animal likeness.

Computer Music Production, 3rd to 8th: This 30 minute class will expose students to the basics of Computer Music Production. We will use different types of DAW's (Digital Audio Workstations) ex: GarageBand, Ableton, to demonstrate the capabilities of electronic music recording and sound synthesis. No prior music knowledge or theory is necessary to enjoy and learn with a DAW which is a great opportunity for those either uncomfortable or unable to learn an acoustic instrument, but still want to interact with the creative musical process. We will start with pre-made sounds and loops that engage simply with the electronic medium, similar to that of playing with Legos, and eventually leading to students using their own sounds and ideas to create their unique works. The goal is to give kids the opportunity to see how music in the 21st century is being created, recorded, and shared.
